ORDER

MASTER
BEFORE A JUDGE OF THE COURT

ON THE APPLICATION of the Petitioner, without a hearing and by consent:

THIS COURT ORDERS that the Respondent, Julie Anne Lee, until such time as she becomes a registered member of the British Columbia Veterinary Medical Association ("BCVMA") in good standing or falls within an exemption set out in Section 28 of the *Veterinarians Act*, is prohibited and enjoined, in her personal capacity or under any business name, including the Respondent Adored Beast Veterinary Clinic Ltd., whether or not for or in expectation of a fee, compensation or reward, from practising or offering to practise veterinary medicine within the meaning of Sections 1 and 27 of the *Veterinarians Act* and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, from:

- (a) diagnosing or offering to diagnose an animal disease, ailment, deformity, defect or injury;


- (b) advising on or offering to advise on the physical condition of an animal;
- (c) prescribing or administering a drug, serum, medicine or any substance or remedy for the cure, treatment or prevention of an animal disease, ailment, deformity, defect or injury;
- (d) prescribing or administering a treatment or performing an operation or manipulation or supplying or applying any apparatus or appliance for the cure, treatment or prevention of any animal disease, ailment, deformity, defect or injury; and
- (e) alleging or implying in any manner that she is qualified, able or willing to diagnose, prescribe for, prevent or treat any animal disease, ailment, deformity, defect or injury or to perform any operation to remedy any animal disease, ailment, deformity, defect or injury, or to examine or advise on the physical condition of an animal.

AND THIS COURT FURTHER ORDERS that the Respondent, Julie Anne Lee, until such time as she becomes a registered member of the BCVMA in good standing, is prohibited and enjoined from taking or using any name, title, addition or description which states, implies or is calculated to lead people to infer that she is a veterinarian or veterinary practitioner or that she is a member of the BCVMA and, particularly, that she is prohibited and enjoined in her personal capacity or under any business name, including the Respondent Adored Beast Veterinary Clinic Ltd., from taking or using the title "Doctor" and the title "practitioner".


AND THIS COURT FURTHER ORDERS that nothing in this order shall limit the Respondent, Julie Anne Lee's ability to work as a service provider in conjunction with a veterinary practice under the proper delegation and supervision of a veterinarian who is a registered member of the BCVMA in good standing as the terms "delegation" and "supervision" are defined, described and employed in the *Veterinarians Act* and under the Bylaws (including the Code of Ethics) of the British Columbia Veterinary Medical Association.

AND THIS COURT FURTHER ORDERS that costs are awarded to the Petitioner in the total amount of \$2,500 (TWO THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS), including taxes and disbursements, payable within 30 days of the date of this Order.
