3. ITEMS REQUIRING COUNCIL ACTION/DECISION/DISCUSSION

3.1. Update from the BCVTA (verbal)

The CVBC Liaison provided an update to Council, which included that the incoming President of the BCVTA has resigned from the position and Ms. Barker has taken on the role in addition to her CVBC Liaison role.

3.2. Certified Technicians Regulation & Veterinarians Act (verbal)

Presented by the Registrar for discussion.

The Council was provided with background information on this matter, including barriers to the recognition of RVTs under the Act.

3.3. <u>Investigation Committee Reappointment</u>

Presented by the Registrar for discussion and decision.

Dr. John Bratty has been the chair of the Investigation Committee and is eligible for and interested in serving another term. Dr. Bratty has proven himself to be a capable, committed, and effective member and chair of the IC. The College recommends his reappointment.

3.6. National Examining Board Representative Nomination

The College recommends Dr. Stacey Thomas for the position. Dr. Thomas possesses the professional and institutional knowledge and experience required to effectively serve as the College's representative to the NEB, particularly during a time of change in the dynamic between the veterinary regulators and the NEB.

3.7. CABRO Update

3.8. CNAR Annual National Conference (verbal)

Presented by the Registrar for information.

CNAR is the Canadian equivalent of CLEAR. The College has been invited to speak at their upcoming conference in October 2025. The panel will consist of Ms. Arnold, Dr. Thomas, and Mr. Greg Cavouras. The title of the session is *When a Regulator Gets Left Behind: The Problem with Decentralized Provincial Oversight of Professional Regulation*.

3.9. <u>CLEAR Board of Directors Nomination</u> – Christine Arnold (verbal) Presented by the Registrar for information.

Ms. Arnold has been nominated to stand for election to the board of CLEAR. The voting period ends on September 8, 2025. The results will be announced in mid-September.

In addition, Dr. Christine Smetschka, the College's Senior Inspector, has been nominated for CLEAR's Investigative Excellence Award.

3.10. Great Places to Work – 2025 Best Workplaces in Government & Social Services (June 2025). The College was awarded the Great Place to Work certification in March 2025 and became eligible for a variety of sub-awards, which include the Globe and Mails' Best Workplace Award. Unfortunately, the College is not eligible for that award as it requires 25 full-time employees, but the College was awarded the Best Workplaces in Government & Social Services Award, effective June 2025.

Council is very pleased with this and the other previously mentioned awards and speaking engagements.
